**Former Torrance Inspector Dies**

A former Torrance building inspector, William H. Munds, suffered a cerebral hemorrhage and died on July 31, it was revealed here this week by a friend of the former city worker.

Munds and his wife, Madge, returned in December of last year from a trip to Japan, where Munds was employed as a U. S. Government mining engineer. He died in Joplin, Missouri while working for the Bureau of Mines. The 61-year-old engineer leaves his wife and three children, John of Inglewood, Frank of Compton and Mrs. Madge Ford, also of Compton.

He joined the City Building Department in 1947 resigning in 1949 to go to Japan.

He was born in Flagstaff, Arizona.
