

Methodists Make Final Plans for United Advance

Final plans are being made by the First Methodist Church of Torrance to join with 150 other Methodist churches in the Los Angeles area in a great United Evangelistic Advance, according to Rev. Clarence E. Miller, minister of the local church.

The United Evangelistic Advance will provide a program of visitation and preaching services from November 11 to 18. Ministers of the various churches in Arizona, San Diego, San Bernardino and Santa Barbara areas will be appointed to direct the visitation and preach at the nightly services in the local churches.

In the second phase of operation, November 25 to December 2, ministers from the Los Angeles area will go to the other areas of the Southern California-Arizona districts to give evangelistic leadership.

Sunday will be the last service before the beginning of the United Evangelistic Advance and Rev. Miller will preach on the theme: "Are You For or Against God?"

Lamentations Source of Golden Text

Those who turn to God and follow in right paths shall be saved from the effects of evil, according to this Sunday's lesson-lesson on "Everlasting Punishment" to be read in all Christian Science churches. The Golden Text is from Lamentations: "Wherefore doth a living man complain, a man for the punishment of his sins? Let us search and try our ways, and turn again to the Lord" (3:39, 40).

In a Bible citation from Proverbs the writer declares: "Evil men understand not judgment; but they that seek the Lord understand all things. . . Whoso keepeth the law is a wise son; . . . Mary Baker Eddy says in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "The moral law, which has the right to acquit or condemn, always demands restitution before mortals can 'go up higher.' Broken law brings penalty in order to compel this progress" (p. 11).
