

Spring Mumps Epidemic Expected In L. A. County

A county-wide epidemic of mumps next spring was predicted this week by County Health Officer Dr. Roy O. Gilbert, who pointed out that although the disease should now be at low ebb, more than a hundred new cases are being reported to the department each week.

The health officer warned parents that mumps is not necessarily accompanied by a swelling under the ears, and for that reason children having headaches, fever, or stiff neck or back should be put to bed in order to prevent dangerous secondary complications.

As an illustration of the fact that mumps is sometimes difficult to diagnose, he said that a good number of cases diagnosed as poliomyelitis have been proved to be mumps meningitis. The correct diagnosis in some cases has been made only after the appearance of characteristic swelling under the ears. In some cases no swelling has occurred and the mumps diagnosis has been made by laboratory test. The doctor explained that a disturbance of the central nervous system accompanies many cases of mumps and is responsible for symptoms common to poliomyelitis, such as stiff neck and

back. Dr. Gilbert advised parents to the child from contracting a secondary infection from apparently healthy carriers of disease or infection. He advised parents to isolate any child having mumps as a precaution to preventing complications.
