Rev. George H. Schuster, who is now pastor of the Elk Grove, California, St. Peter's Lutheran Church will officiate at the 8:15 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. services Sunday.

A potluck dinner and get-together will follow during the noon hour, and every one has been extended an invitation by the church pastor to attend the noon festivities.

The First Lutheran Church of Torrance had its beginning April 27, 1926, when the Lutherans of Torrance and vicinity met at the Episcopal Parish Hall here to organize a congregation. Twenty-seven members signed the first charter.

Pastors serving the congregation have included Reverend Lange, Reverend Schuster, Rev. Frank Meehling, and Reverend Wenske. Reverend Meehling is deceased.

Several new members will be received into the church Sunday.

Sermon Topic For Sunday Announced

The benefits which result from living according to spiritual law are pointed out in the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Mortals and Immortals" in all Christian Science churches. The Golden Text from Romans (8:13) declares: "If ye live after the flesh, ye shall die; but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live."

Bible citations include these verses from the Psalms: "The Lord is my strength and song, and is become my salvation. I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord" (118:14,17).
 In the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," Mary Baker Eddy says, "Man being immortal, has a perfect indestructible life. It is the mortal belief which makes the body decadent and diseased in proportion as ignorance, fear, or human will governs mortals." "God is more to a man than his belief, and the less we acknowledge matter or its laws, the more immortality we possess." (Pp. 209,425.)

Revival Series To Be Continued


The Walteria Assembly of God Church will continue revival services this week with Evangelist Bob and Deion Sharon of Hollywood, it has been announced.
