

## Sentinel Flash Moves Talents To Samohi Turf



The Bay League slate will open on January 4, when the Tartars play host to Ingewood. A schedule break finds Torrance at home for its final three Bay League games.



## Tartars Score Win Over Narbonne High

Coach Cliff Graybehl and his Terrible Tartars wound up the 1951 football season in style last week with a 19-7 victory over the Narbonne Gauchos on the Torrance turf.

Holding a commanding lead in the game after a t.d. early in the second quarter, the Tartars were fairly snug in victory before the Gauchos capitalized.

on the accurate passing of Dapper Dan Montgomery in the fourth quarter for a t.d.—their second of the season. Everybody was happy after the game — the Tartars had scored a clean triumph over their former Marine League foe, and the Gauchos had pushed through the Tartar defense for a touchdown—a special kind of victory for the hard luck Narbonites.

Star of the game for the losers was Montgomery, in the line-up for the first time since a head injury benched him early in the season.

### DAPPER DAN HOT

He passed, ran and bothered the Tartars enough during the evening that the Gauchos were a threat every time they entered the ball.

The Tartars scored in the second period when Harry Bayliss carried the pigskin down to the one-foot line in a series of brilliant runs. Beryl Jones bulled over from that point for the tally.

End Larry Roy set up the second tally when he intercepted one of Montgomery's passes and returned it 42 yards to the Narbonne 23. A screen pass from Crawford to Jones put the ball on the one-yard line and Charlie Camou crashed over for the second t.d. Torrance led 13-0 at the halftime.

### O'CAIN SCORES

Camou ran a punt back 38 yards to set up the third Tartar score in the fourth quarter. Jack O' Cain, on an end-around play, went over for the 19th point.

Narbonne's lone tally came in the fourth when Dick Rathbun recovered a fumble on the Tartar 37. On the first play after that, Montgomery heaved a long pass to Jack Dalton, who caught it on the five and dove over for the score.

### Postgame activities in the dressing room were almost as rugged as the play on the gridiron.

Coaches Graybehl and Vern Wolfe were treated to an impromptu shower as were several of the managers of the team.


