

# Vaughan Heads East

Jimmie Vaughan, Torrance's top bowler, left yesterday for Chicago and a crack at the National Match Game championships starting Saturday.

This will be the second time the transplant of Texas has qualified for a spot in the tournament—rated as America's toughest ten-pin championship to capture.

Four years ago Vaughan qualified as a Los Angeles entry, but failed to place in the money. This year he qualified from Long Beach.

No newcomer to the bowling wars, Vaughan began his career in 1940. Since that time he has racked up nine 300 games. Four of those came in California—one in Torrance Bowl—and the other five in Texas. Vaughan's perfect game here started a four-game series in which he averaged a torrid 280.

Now living at 1415 Greenwood here, Vaughan and his wife were in Torrance in 1947. Then they returned to Texas, while Jimmie was attending Southern Methodist University. During his college stay, Vaughan took enough time off to team with another Dallas kiegler, Carl Richards, to capture second place in the 1949 American Bowling Congress tourney in Atlantic City. They finished with identical 657 series, for a total of 1314. To add another unusual twist to this performance, they rolled the series on alleys 13 and 14.

Vaughan returned to Torrance in September of this year, immediately following graduation at SMU in August. He's now employed as an accountant in Long Beach.

In 1946 Vaughan bowled in the Chicago Classic league in the Windy City. This league is rated as the best, and toughest, in U. S. bowling circles.

This year Jimmie, and his brother Ace, another Torrance resident, roll in three leagues at Torrance Bowl, plus the Long Beach Classic at Virginia. Jimmie has a top average of 194 in the 500 Trio Scratch league here.

Earlier this year Ace Vaughan won the \$3000 singles tournament at Luxor Bowl in Los Angeles.

# Torrid Tor-Loms Go After 8th Straight

# Sportsman's Calendar

The Department of Fish and Game reminds California sportsmen of the following general regulations which apply to current hunting and fishing:

**Bears**—Ends December 31. Bag limit: 1 bear in Siskiyou, Trinity, Shasta, Lassen, Modoc and Plumas counties; 2 bears elsewhere. No closed season or bag limit in Del Norte, Humboldt and Mendocino counties.

**Waterfowl**—Ends January 5 along Colorado River; ends December 24 elsewhere. Bag and possession limits: 6 ducks, 6 geese, 15 coots, 25 mergansers; no more than 1 wood duck, 2 Canada geese or subspecies, 2 whitefronted geese, or 3 brant.

**Shooting hours**—one-half hour before sunrise to one hour before sunset.

**Quail**—Closed in Inyo and Mono counties and southeastern area; ends December 15 in District 14; ends December 31 elsewhere. Bag and possession limits: 8 per day.

**Tree Squirrels**—Ends December 31 in Districts 1 (except Plumas County and south of Merced-Mariposa county line), 14, 23, 25; Siskiyou County in District 14; Trinity County; Santa Clara County east of Highway 101 and northwest of Highway 17; and San Mateo County east of Skyline Boulevard. No open season elsewhere. Bag limit: 2 per day, 2 in possession.

**Brush and Cottontail Rabbits**—Ends December 15 in District 14; December 31 elsewhere. Bag and possession limits: 4 per day.

**Steelhead Trout and Salmon**—Ends January 31 in specified waters of Siskiyou and Trinity counties; bag limit: 3 trout or salmon or combination; December 1 to February 29 in specified waters of central California counties, bag limit: 2 trout or salmon or combination; ends February 29 in other specified waters of central and southern California counties, bag limit: 2 trout or salmon or combination.
