Harbor Area Employers Set Meeting Date

A meeting of employers in the Harbor Area who are parties to the mercantile contract with Retail Clerks Local No. 905 will be held in the office of the Harbor Area Employers' Council, 1308 Sartori avenue, Suite 14, on Thursday, December 27, 1951, at 1:45 p.m., according to Frank S. Selover, executive secretary of the council. Employer proposals for the contract will be discussed.

He said that a negotiating committee will be elected, and stressed the importance of full attendance of all employers involved.

The mercantile contract between employers of this area and Local 905 expires on January 31, 1952.

It is expected that union demands for a five-day week, eight hours a day, will be among the principal points of negotiation. The union is asking such increases in wages as are allowable under government wage regulations. It was said but these amounts can be determined only by a survey of all employers involved.

The Employers' Council executive secretary also announced that the annual meeting of the membership will be held in the council office on January 17, 1952, starting at 2 p.m. Directors for the ensuing two-year term will be elected.

The Harbor Area Employers' Council will enter its fourth year of activity on behalf of employers in the labor relations field in 1952, Selover said.
