## Unemployment Claims Subject To New Provision

Unemployment insurance claims filed on and after January 1, 1952, are subject to a new provision of the California Unemployment Insurance Act. Mrs. Winona Ellis, manager of the Torrance office of the State Department of Employment, said today.

"Heretofore an individual, if otherwise eligible, could file a claim for benefits and draw out his award; and on the anniversary date of his original claim, file another claim and draw additional benefits without the necessity of having worked during that year," Mrs. Ellis said.

"The new amendment makes this impossible since it is now mandatory that a claimant earn sufficient wages during the year that he draws unemployment insurance benefits to qualify for a claim during the following year," she said.
