They raised questions concerning allowances, proper school attire, the wearing of lipstick and dating.

Some of the questions posed during the debate were: How much should we get, if we get an allowance? Should we have a definite schedule of work? In your opinion what is appropriate clothing for school? Should girls wear jeans? Should eighth grade girls use lipstick? How young should teenagers be allowed to date? These questions were discussed frankly by the students and some serious thinking took place.

The 10 students on the panel were selected by their classmates to represent them. Miss Chisholm, who acted as moderator, extended an invitation to all present to attend the class workshop. It is a weekly event held each Friday afternoon at 1 o'clock. Mrs. Carolyn H. Ditton, school nurse, presented a health film, "How to Catch Cold." This film has been shown to all students in both schools.

During the business session Mrs. R. E. Murphy, ways and means chairman, announced that T-shirts bearing the name Fern Avenue or Greenwood School would be sold by the PTA. The shirts will sell for ninety cents and may be ordered by calling Mrs. Murphy at 2408-J.

Mrs. G. J. Derouin was elected to serve as representative from the Fern Avenue-Greenwood PTA for the nomination of officers of the Torrance Council. Mrs. G. G. Grubb will act as alternate.
