C. S. Church Topic Is Mind

"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!" This Bible verse from Psalms (133:1) is included in the lesson-sermon on the subject of "Mind" in all Christian Science churches on Sunday.

A correlative selection from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy points out, "When we realize that there is one Mind, the divine law of loving our neighbor as ourselves is unfolded; whereas a belief in many ruling minds hinders man's normal drift towards the one Mind, one God, and leads human thought into opposite channels where selfishness reigns" (p. 205).

The president of a Construction Company won a contract on a Friday. He wouldn't start work on "That unlucky day," but his superintendent did and that bridge has stood for 30 years. We develop nuclear fission yet refuse to use 13 as numeral on hotel rooms or to designate a floor. Would you turn back if a black cat ran across your path?

Why do you wear a wedding ring? It came out of the belief in love potions. Why do you shake hands? Or kiss? These manifestations of affection began long before man was taught to express himself in words. This is folklore that came to us with our baby's milk; we are adding to it every day.

Who taught you to cook? Your mother. Who taught you to fish? Swing a baseball bat? Carry a hiker's pack? Split a log? Your father. Did you learn to drive a car by reading instructions? Someone showed you. Do you dance according to rules in a book? Someone taught you. As long as we teach by folklore we are building folklore.
