
HOLY

In the Ten Commandments, which do you suppose gets the larger treatment? Reverent observance of the divine order for a day of rest and of worship gets chief emphasis. A moment's reflection makes the reason clear. The man who does not take time to keep the Sabbath will likely forget to worship the God of his fathers; he who does not reverence God cannot be expected to regard his neighbor and his neighbor's goods. Sabbath observance stands, therefore, at the very center of religion and of morality. Then if you disregard the Sabbath you do it at the peril of your soul!

Notice the argument of Moses. God could get His work done in six days, even the creation of a universe and all its creatures. Surely you do not need the seventh day for the lesser tasks of your doing.

You are under the command of God; you are a part of His creation; there is nothing more important for you than that you remember God and your relation to Him. The Sabbath is such a time of remembrance. The church bell, the rest from daily toil, the quietness in the busy street, the need of your own soul, unite to remind you of your God and His day. The law gives commandment: His people to keep this one day sacred to the Lord; to use it for one's own profit is to rob God of the time which belongs to Him.

Here is an ancient command, never more important than today. The press of the material and the secular was never more insistent; things want to get in the saddle and ride mankind. Remember the Sabbath; then you will worship God and know that you are the eternal child of the Highest. He who remembers the Sabbath most is most likely to remember to attend his church.

The Rev. J. Russell Killman, now traveling with a Youth for Christ mission in the Far East, arrived recently at Taipei after a stay in Manila.

He is presently speaking in the Ho Ping Church, with the aid of an interpreter. He is scheduled to start addressing Chinese youths in the schools and in the Presbyterian Church there.

Mr. Killman, who is spreading the word of the Gospel of St. John, left three weeks ago for the two-month trip.

Plans have been made, it was reported, to go to an island off of the mainland of China, where sermons to the Nationalist Chinese troops will be held.

THE PRICE ON WASHINGTON'S HEAD

There are few men who would pile fortune and life on the scale of independence against the strongest Nation on earth. Washington o n did.

He stood at the head of an Army, without authority to punish or compel obedience. Actually, he had command of 13 armies, each of which was answerable to a separate colony; none of whom would commit itself to a declaration of war. He wrote to Congress who by an act on Nov. 7th, 1775 committed the Colonies to independence. Britain called it an act of treason, punishable by death. Washington accepted this dictum.

Washington put his fortune, and his life, in the balance of a nebulous cause; he won all three. Honor him of Feb. 22nd as the man who "Stuck out his neck" that we could be free.
