

Rev. Killman Lands 'On Wing and Prayer'

The Rev. J. Russell Killman, now traveling in the Far East on a Youth for Christ mission, escaped possible injury when the PBX which he and three other "team members" were riding crash landed on a Kimmen Island airstrip.

In Formosa Report 6, one of the periodic letters written by Mr. Killman to church members here, he states that the plane came in on a wing and a prayer. "We boarded the airplane in Taipei at 1:30 p.m. . . . We were flying at 500 feet to avoid being picked up by Communist radar on the mainland. . . . I had just taken a motion picture out of the pilot's window when the light flashed on the cabin to fasten our seat belts.

"The plane let down its landing gear and started in for a landing. I had just settled back and thanked the Lord for a safe trip when the noise started. The right wheel on the PBX didn't lock in place and we careened to the right, traveling about 100 mph.

"Our safety belts were beginning to pull on our stomachs. After coming to a stop I looked out the emergency window and saw that we had come in on a wing and a prayer, for our left wheel and the right wing were all that had held the plane off the ground."

Mr. Killman and one of his associates, Ed Reese, entertained at a Chinese USO—Mr. Reese playing his accordion and Mr. Killman his trumpet.

"After seven numbers by a Chinese string band and some more by a western style military band, it was our turn. . . . We sang and played for the men and they brought down the house with applause. . . .

"The men were finally satisfied when we had given seven numbers. Even the Chinese movie stars who traveled with the USO team didn't get the ova-

Sermon Topic Is 'Matter'

Material beliefs and trusts must be exposed to make room for spiritual understanding and its rewards, according to the Sunday Bible Lesson on "Matter" in all Christian Science churches.

This counsel of Paul to the Colossians (3:2) constitutes the Golden Text: "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth."

The Lesson-Sermon includes these words of Jesus from Matthew (6:31, 33): "Take no thought, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or, 'What shall we drink?' or, 'Where shall we find clothing?' . . . But seek ye first the Kingdom of God, and all these things shall be added unto you."

On this subject, Mary Baker Eddy says in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "If we follow the command of our Master, 'Take no thought for your life,' we shall never depend on bodily conditions, structure, or economy, but we shall be masters of the body, dictate its terms, and form and control it with Truth" (p. 228).

Nurses to Ask For Pay Raise

Requests for a salary range of \$259-\$319 per month for nurses at Harbor General Hospital will soon will be put before the Board of Supervisors, it was announced this week by the Los Angeles County Employees Union, Local No. 347 (AFL).

E. L. Bratrud, business representative of the union, said that the salary of nurses working for county hospitals had not kept pace with cost of living increases during the past three years and that the nurses are not receiving wages comparable to those in private and government industry.

Affiliation of county nurses with the Employees Local 347 has been recently completed, Bratrud said.
