

Pepperdine Psychologist To Address Torrance PTA

Dr. Everett L. Shostrum, head of the department of psychology at George Pepperdine College, will be the keynote speaker at the Torrance Elementary PTA meeting tonight at 7:30 in the school.

Choosing as his topic "Helping the Child to Help Himself," Dr. Shostrum will draw upon his background as a lecturer and counselor in psychology for material.

Appointed to his departmental position early in 1951, Shostrum is also serving as director of the Pepperdine Psychological Clinic which opened in January. He has taught evening courses at USC and UCLA and was a counselor and instructor at Stanford University where he received his Ph. D. in 1950. He






