These words were those said by Jesus Christ as he hung on the Cross on Good Friday.



Edwin Bowling, minister of the Walteria Methodist Church, will preach on the fourth word; the Rev. F. A. Brunson, minister of the Nazarene Church, will preach on the fifth word; the Rev. Cecil J. England, minister of the First Christian Church, will preach on the sixth word, and the rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, the Rev. Arthur E. Bello, will preach on the seventh and last word.

The entire Good Friday program will be under the direction of the Rev. Paul C. Wenske, pastor of the First Lutheran Church of Torrance.
