Here's List of Regulations for Calif. Sportsmen

The Department of Fish and Game reminds California sportsmen of the following general regulations which apply to current hunting and fishing:

JACK RABBITS—Closed in Southern California Districts 4, 4A, 4B, 19, 20 and 22. No closed season elsewhere. No bag limit.

TROUT—No closed season in Colorado River area only. Bag and possession limit: 10 trout.

CATFISH—No closed season. Bag limit: 15 fish. Night fishing permitted in Siskiyou, Shasta, Lake, Modoc, Tehama, Butte, Glenn, Colusa, Yuba, Sutter and Inyo Counties, and in Pit River, Lassen County.

BLACK BASS, SUN FISH, CRAPPIE, SACRAMENTO PERCH—Closed in all counties north of Mono, Fresno, San Benito, Santa Clara, Madera and Santa Cruz Counties. No closed season elsewhere. Bag limits: 5 black bass, 25 sunfish, crappie, perch. Local exceptions.

STRIPED BASS—No closed season. Bag limit: 5 fish or 25 pounds and one fish or 2 fish regardless of weight. Minimum size limit: 12 inches.

SHAD—No closed season. Bag limit: 5 fish until March 14. No limit at other times. Angling hours: From one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset, or by hand dipnet at any time.

OCEAN FISH—No closed season in Pacific Ocean for tuna, yellowtail, marlin, broadbill swordfish, black sea bass, barracuda, white sea bass, bonito, rock bass, sand bass, kelp bass, halibut, corbina, croaker, lingcod and cabezone. Bag limits: 15 in aggregate, but not more than 10 of any one of other species listed above, nor more than 2 marlin, swordfish or black sea bass.

OCEAN SALMON—Bag limits: Three trout or salmon or combination in ocean waters north of the Monterey-San Luis Obispo County line; two fish south of line. Minimum size limit: 22 inches; one undersized fish permitted.

CLAMS—Bag limits: 10 Pismo, 30 razor, 10 big neck, 10 Washington; no limit on jack knife clams.

COCKLES—Bag limit: 50. Minimum size limit: 1 1/2 inches.

SCALLOPS—No closed season. Bag limit: 50. Minimum size limit: two inches in diameter.

Workers Clearing Crowley Lake Roads of Ice, Snow

Although Crowley Lake is still covered with 14 inches of ice beneath two feet of snow, it appears that the opening of the 1952 angling season at the famed "home of the big trout" on Saturday, May 3, will go off on schedule, the Los Angeles City Recreation and Park Department reported this week.

George Marks, the department's Crowley Lake manager, is now at the huge High Sierra man-made reservoir. He has informed the department that his staff is now attempting to clear the snow from the road leading from Whitmore Hot Springs to the lake's North Landing, where the city's inboard motorboats and rowboats, together with the North and South Landings' docks, are stored.

According to Marks, Custodian Lloyd Bpavers was marooned in his Whitmore Hot Springs residence, which was almost completely covered with snow, for

three weeks, with only his three dogs for company. Mrs. Beavers had journey to Los Angeles for a visit with relatives, and was unable to rejoin her husband.

The department again reminded anglers planning to join the Crowley Lake "big fish parade" that the city's supply of rental boats are being rapidly snapped up for the week of May 3-11, and for the 1952 season's later dates, through July 31.

With assignments made on a first-come, first-served basis, reservations are now being accepted by the Recreation and Park Department by mail, telephone, or "in person" at Room 225, L. A. City Hall, Los Angeles 12, Michigan 5211, Station 552.

There are no city boats available for reservation for Saturday and Sunday, May 3-4, the first two days of the coming season.


