More Trout, Salmon Now

Trout and salmon fishermen were rejoicing happily this week following an announcement from the Department of Fish and Game that more than 265 tons of trout and salmon were planted in California lakes and streams during the fiscal year. In Los Angeles County alone, 162,790 fish weighing 21,165 pounds were turned loose in the various streams.

The department said that 88 per cent of the annual plant was made up of catchable-sized fish, 6 to 9 inches in length. The production of 24 state hatchery installations amounted to 17,751,000 fish.
