Robert L. Brown, son of E. B. Brown, business manager of the Torrance Herald, left yesterday for Denver, Colo., for induction into the armed forces.



Rev. Clarence E. Miller, pastor of the First Methodist Church, will leave tomorrow evening for San Francisco where he will attend the General Conference of the Methodist Church as a member of the "Hospitality Staff."

The General Conference is the law-making body of the Methodist Church and it meets every four years. The conference is made up of delegates from churches all over the world. The Southern California-Arizona conference is entitled to seven ministerial and seven lay delegates at the meeting.

The conference will be held at the Civic Center in San Francisco, and it is the first such held in the West by the church since 1902, Rev. Miller reports.

Besides the pastor, two other members of the Torrance congregation plan to attend as unofficial visitors. They are Mrs. Grace Hooper and Mrs. Maude R. Obarr.

During the pastor's absence, his wife, Mrs. Vinita Miller, will fill the pulpit on April 27. Miss Helen Ferris, a returned missionary from China, will be in the pulpit on May 4. Miss Ferris spent 2 1/2 years in China after the Communist forces took control. Mayor Mervin Schwab will conduct the worship service and introduce Miss Ferris, the pastor announced.

## Guard Against Rabies, Owners Of Dogs Warned

The Torrance area should be on its guard against possible invasion of rabies, now approaching epidemic stage in some parts of Southern California, Mrs. Ralph Blunk of the South Bay Humane Society warned yesterday.

It is more essential than ever that dogs be kept at home or on a leash, she said. While no rabies cases have been reported here, they have been noted as close as Inglewood.

Plans are now being made to set up a temporary clinic at the South Bay Humane Society within the next few days with all veterinarians of the South Bay cooperating in a program of inoculation.
