RANCHERS MEET, PLAN FLY KILLING BATTLE

A campaign to battle flies, which breed in pens, stables and yards of local ranchers will be conducted this year through the auspices of the University of California farm advisor's bureau. A meeting was held Monday, at which poultrymen were told when and how to knock out flies.

John Williams, 1866 W. 247th St., a poultry raiser, held the meeting at his home. Charles A. Salverson, farm advisor from the University of California, was the "fly killing expert."

Flies reach maturity about ten days after the eggs are laid. Salverson said, and can be controlled if pens, stables and yards are cleaned thoroughly every ten days and sprayed with special germicides which dry out breeding spots.

In most areas flies have developed an immunity to many of the "miracle" bug-killers such as the DDT developed during the last war, he told the ranchers. Complete cleanliness and the use of new larvicides can control the problem, however, he related.

Ranchers who raise hogs, poultry, cattle and rabbits attended the meeting.

Family Fund Lack Slows Medical Aid

Little Henry Johnson, 2½, does not know that doctors have given up all hope of stamping out the dreaded leukemia which has wasted away his tiny body.

And Henry doesn't know that all available medical attention is far removed from him because his mother and father are handicapped—by a lack of money.

And Henry doesn't know that unless enough funds are received by his mommy and daddy, he will have to be taken from the hospital Sunday—no more funds.

Already the neighbors of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Johnson, Apt. 436, Harbor Hills, are gathering funds to help the little lad live a little longer.

Henry's condition was not

discovered until two weeks ago when the disease had reached an advanced, incurable stage. He is undergoing treatment at Queen of Angels Hospital, not for cure, only to prolong his dwindling life.

Mrs. Johnson, who is expecting her second child in two months, was told by doctors that there is no hope of curing Henry and that she and her husband should resign themselves to the inevitable death of their son.

The family has poured its entire savings—a meager \$350, which was to pay hospital bills at the birth of the second baby, into needed medical attention for Henry Jr.

Johnson, a student at Northrop Aircraft Corp., where he is studying to be an aeronautical engineer under the GI Bill, has only a small income.

Mrs. Johnson said that the little tike first complained of a pain in his legs. A local physician diagnosed the illness as leukemia—which has now become a word synonymous with death.

Since that time he has been under a specialist's care at the Queen of the Angels.

Yesterday funds started to pour into the home of the Johnsons. A committee of neighbors, headed by Mrs. Alfred Bohl and Mrs. Irvin D. Burke made a house to house canvass in an appeal for aid.

Lomita Woman's Wisteria Rivals Banning Vine

Mrs. Helene Williams, 2043 W. 255th St., isn't trying to put Banning Park in Wilmington out of business as a show place, but she's running a mighty close second.

For on Mrs. Williams' house is a 20-year-old wisteria vine which rivals in its lush beauty, but not its size that now on display in Banning Park.

The vine has attracted scores of onlookers. It covers the entire front of the house and is now growing across a trellis adjacent to the house. Total length of the vine is about 50 feet, while the Banning Park wisteria interlaces some two-hundred feet of trellis.


Requiring but little attention, Mrs. Williams' vine continues to grow and grow. Last year she cut it back because it was shutting out much of the light into the living room windows.
