### Grenshaw Paving... Arbitrator

**Contract Due Within 30 Days**

The contract will be let for the paving of Grenshaw Blvd. from Lomita Blvd. to Highway 101 within 30 days, according to Supervisor Raymond V. Darby. Darby said that it was hoped that within a year the rights of way would be obtained which would enable the county to pave Grenshaw from Sepulveda Blvd. to Lomita Blvd. Within two years Grenshaw will be a through highway from Wilshire Blvd. in Los Angeles to the ocean on the south slope of the Palos Verdes Hills, according to the county official.

Cost of the Lomita-Highway paving job is approximately \$30,000, the supervisor said. Of this amount, all taken from the 1951-52 budget, \$49,600 from the Highways Through Cities Special Fund and an additional \$39,659 from the County Highway general fund. The balance, \$9,259, is being used to obtain rights of way elsewhere along the highway. The construction of the highway from its present terminus




