The renowned pianist, Artur Rubenstein, will play his only Los Angeles recital in Philharmonic Auditorium this season on Sunday afternoon May 11, at the final event of the Moss-Hayman-Wilson current concert series.

The celebrated keyboard artist who completed his 15th annual coast-to-coast tour with his Pacific coast appearance, has selected his Los Angeles program to include works beloved by all concertgoers as well as the introduction of some seldom heard works.

Foremost among the latter will be his performance of Stravinsky's Piano Sonata in three movements from "Petrouchka," which was dedicated to and written for Rubenstein by the composer. The program will begin with Haydn's "Andante con variazioni in F Minor," followed by Schubert's "Impromptu in A Flat" and the brilliant Beethoven "Sonata, Opus 53" played in two movements.

Tavel's "Ondine from Gaspar de la Nuit" and three Chopin numbers, "Valse in A Flat," "Nocturne in D Flat" and "Scherzo in C Sharp Minor" will complete the program.





