PIGS IN BLANKETS

- 1 lb. bulk or link sausage
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons shortening
- 3/4 cup milk

If bulk sausage is used, shape into 3-inch cylinders about 1-inch thick. Fry sausage slowly until well browned, about 15 to 20 minutes. Sift flour; measure; sift again with baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening. Add milk, stirring only until all flour is dampened. Place on a lightly floured board; knead lightly for 20 to 30 seconds. Roll or pat to one-fourth-inch thickness; cut in 3-inch squares. Place sausage cutwise on squares of dough; fold into triangles. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Bake in hot oven (450° F.) about 15 minutes or until done. Serve plain or with milk gravy.
