**Unemployment Levels Reported
Unchanged During Past 30 Days**

A total of 745 new job openings within five miles of the office were reported in April to the California State Employment Service here during April, it was revealed this week in a report compiled by Mrs. Winona Ellis, manager of the Torrance branch. In addition to the numerous jobs offered in this area, an additional several thousand jobs were listed for adjacent areas primarily El Segundo, Inglewood and Long Beach, Mrs. Ellis reports.

Forty-five per cent of the jobs listed here called for skilled, semi-skilled, or unskilled labor, she says. Farm labor accounted for 35 per cent of the openings and professional, clerical, sales and service for the other 25 per cent.

The May report of the CSES office here shows that a total of 476 residents of Torrance were unemployed and seeking work through the office. This total reflects a slight increase over last month's figures, according to Mrs. Ellis.
