with a statement from Earl Lloyd, secretary of the Planning Commission.

"If this were anybody else but Bert Lynn, if this were a 'little guy' involved, the matter would pass."

Attorney Woolley told the city fathers he was not representing Lynn, but was appearing as counsel for Dr. Rodney Stetson and Dr. Ralph McNeil, tenants in the buildings.

"Torrance needs these additional facilities. Local medical facilities for treatment of the sick and for those injured in industrial accidents has not kept pace with the growth of the city. It is not fair to deprive the entire city of additional medical facilities over one or two parking spaces."

Earlier the Planning Commission indicated it would have approved the addition to the building if it had been two feet shorter. This would have allowed for the parking of two more cars on the lot.

"I feel that the city will be liable for all law suit both from Lynn and the doctors if they halt the construction of the building. My client, Dr. Stetson, has purchased several thousands of dollars of additional x-ray equipment to be placed in the new addition on the promise that the city approved of the addition when one of its officers issued the building permit," Woolley claims.

City Attorney Hall offered the opinion that the solution might be to fine Lynn for proceeding with the building, even though he had a permit, and then allow the construction to continue.

It had been charged that Lynn, a contractor, knew better than to start construction of the building even though he had a permit.

Lynn stated he was sorry for "putting anyone on the spot," even though the error in issuing the permit was not his.

And so the entire matter, hotter than a fresh-baked potato and more tangled than a back-lash on a trout pole, was tossed to City Attorney Hall, who is expected to come up with a magical formula for untangling the matter to everybody's satisfaction—if possible.

## Flash Fire Does Little Damage

A flash-explosion followed by a fire hit the Pony Pack Co., a paper box manufacturing concern, at 1213 W. 253rd St. Tuesday afternoon, but little damage was done.

Los Angeles City firemen from Eng. 85, Harbor City, directed by Act. Batt. Chief George Mason, said the flames had been extinguished by workers when they arrived at the scene. Loss was set at \$50.

The concern is involved in defense work, it was stated.

## Officers Pursue Driver 3 Miles In Speedy Chase

The second chase by police officers down busy streets in three days was reported by Harbor Division police yesterday after they claimed that they finally halted a motorist at 253rd St. and Normandie Ave., after a long high-speed ride.

Booked at San Pedro jail on a drunk driving charge was Manuel Jurado Jr., 25, of Los Angeles, according to police. Officers said they started after the young driver on Gaffey St., south of "Five Points."

Jurado allegedly raced up Gaffey St., ran the stop sign at Anaheim Ave., continued north on Normandie Ave., and was stopped several blocks north of Pacific Coast Hwy.

Officers said the driver attained speeds of 75 miles an hour during the speedy chase.

The body of Pfc. Robert L. Whisler, 1921 W. 253rd St., arrived aboard the S. S. Jericho Victory in San Francisco Tuesday along with 121 Americans who lost their lives fighting in Korea.
