

## Scouts to Vie For Summer Trip At Scout-O-Rama



## Balloting Opens In Straw Votes For President

Mayor Mervin M. Schwab and Chief of Police John Stroth dropped their ballots in a candy-striped box here yesterday and the balloting in the Motorola-TV Straw Poll for the presidential race was under way.

Sponsored throughout Southern California by Motorola dealers, the straw vote will consist of a popularity contest for the presidential candidates and a chance for some of the voters to take home a 20-inch Motorola-TV table model television receiver.

It works like this, according to Charlie Reed, owner of Torrance Tee Vee, local sponsors of the contest:

The contestant marks his ballot for his choice as president, then puts down his guess as to the number of votes he will receive in the straw vote. The persons guessing the closest to each qualified candidate's vote (whether the candidate wins or not) will receive a television set.

The rules on the application blank warn that votes for Killorey or Donald Duck won't be counted.

The winners will be announced June 15, Reed said. The judging will be based on how close the estimates were to the actual number of votes cast for their candidates in the straw vote. This is not a contest based on the number of votes cast in the state primaries, officials explain.

There are no obligations attached to entering the contest, Reed emphasizes. Persons wishing to cast their vote in the straw poll may pick up a ballot at the Torrance Tee Vee, 1629 Cravens Ave., mark it, and drop it in the ballot box provided there for the voters.
