## Edison Company to Start Second Steam Plant in Redondo Soon

Continuing its planned expansion program for the Redondo Steam Station, the Southern California Edison Company has scheduled the start of construction of a second plant there for mid-summer, according to the announcement of Harold Quinton, Edison Company executive vice-president.

Completion of the first of two 156,250 kilowatt generating units is planned for the spring of 1954. The growth of electric service load on the Edison Company system has made the immediate addition to the Redondo Station necessary, Mr. Quinton said. The present section of the station was completed in 1949 and contains 288,000 kilowatts of generating capacity in four units.

Cost of the company's new Redondo plant, with both units, is estimated to be approximately

\$44,000,000. Upon completion the station, with two plants and six generating units, will have a generating capacity of about 600,500 kilowatts and will have cost a total of approximately \$80,000,000.

The new Redondo installation will be the third steam-electric generating plant the company has built since the end of the war. The first Redondo plant was finished in 1949, and the Etiwanda Steam Station now under construction in San Bernardino County will be in operation early next year.

## There's Still Room On YMCA Camp List

That statement, made this week by A. C. Turner, Camp Committee Chairman of the Torrance Y. M. C. A., preceded a plea to parents to sign up their boys early for the Round Meadow camping trip, leaving here July 22.

Describing the camp as a "wonderful site located in the Barton Flats area of the San Bernardino mountains," he said the "Y" staff has planned a complete, interesting program for boys, 9-14.

"We have space for 130 boys at this modern camp, and for eight days there will be all kinds of adventure that youngsters like," he said.

The program will include horseback riding, hiking, and exploring, swimming, interesting campfire programs, regular church services and handicraft projects, the youth worker said.

He added that the youngsters will be housed in Adlon-dak cabins and there are excellent messhall and handicraft facilities.

According to Turner, the program, which stresses group experience, is one of the best ways to teach youngsters the principles of fair play and how to get along with their fellow men.

Adult leadership for the campers will be furnished by local young men who give spare time to Y.M.C.A. workers will be housed in Adlon-dak and by permanent personnel at the camp.
