## Burglars Beware!

# Direct Wire Alarm Sends Cops On Run

Burglars and stick-up men don't have a chance with this newly-installed device. A flick of a switch, the flash of a tell-tale red light and a host of Torrance policemen swarm to the scene of the crime. For whether it's a burglar after store hours, or a hold-up man during business hours, a new alarm device installed at the Jim Dandy market, Crenshaw and Torrance Blvds., is designed to afford officers a chance to "get their man."

**By Direct Wire**  
Directly wired to a control panel at the Torrance Police Station, the device will go off when any door or window is tampered with, or when a clerk brushes against a concealed button near the check stands.

In a flash, radio cars are detailed from the Torrance area to move in on the market culprits.

Each time the market is locked up for the night, or opened in the morning, a direct telephone system from market to police tells that everything's "George," and the broken connection of a door opening or closing is being done by an authorized person.

The unique alarm, rented from a San Pedro firm, is controlled from the police station, unlike most, which are handled at the store end. The desk sergeant each morning and night throws a tiny switch which tests the current flow through the system and then talks by direct phone to the person closing or


