Firemen Snuff Out Garage, Shed Blaze

A blaze which firemen said was started by sparks from an open rubbish fire swept through a wooden garage-storage house and threatened a near-by residence before it was doused by fast-acting crews from the county fire department, Sunday morning.

Two engine companies and a fire patrol unit, supervised by Capt. Roy Swank, Eng. 6, snuffed out the blaze at 2432 Chaparral Dr. within 15 minutes from the time the first call was received. Damage was confined to the storage shed and some scorched trees.

Owner of the building is A. N. Trefethen, a county fireman who was on duty as a fire truck driver at Lennox engine house. His wife, Joan, discovered the building ablaze and summoned fire fighters.

Damage was estimated at \$450.

Lomita firemen joined without both fires Sunday.

Local Firemen See Selves in New Movie

Torrance firemen and city officials got a preview peek at a new "television" film this week, featuring none other than members and fire trucks from the local fire station.

Directed by Will Zens, the 15-minute black-and-white feature tells the story of "Punch and Trudy," a pair of average kids who get a promised reward for doing a big job.
