Not only did one entry in the Santa Barbara Festival receive wide acclaim from the spectators, but the governor of the state sent word that he thought it was tops, also.


Judge Willett Slated for TV

Supervisors' Salary Hike To Go on November Ballot

At the request of a number of prominent Los Angeles citizens, the Board of Supervisors Tuesday voted to place a charter amendment on the ballot at the November election which would raise salaries of supervisors from the present \$5600 per year to \$16,500, according to Supervisor Raymond V. Darby.

The group was led by James L. Beebe, who is chairman of the state and local government committee for the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce. He stressed the fact that although the board members receive an additional \$4800 annually as members of the Board of Directors of the County Flood Control District, they are very much underpaid.

In his presentation, Attorney Beebe stated that the salaries of the Board of Supervisors were fixed forty years ago at \$5000, which at that time was equal to the salaries of Superior Court judges. Only in recent years has the additional \$4800 compensation been in effect.

Beebe declared that Los Angeles County today has a greater population than any one of 38 individual states of the Union; that its population grew from 583,000 40 years ago to a estimated population today of 1,222,000.
