Van Dyck, 1519 W. 214th St., who is now attending Oregon State College is among the 80 Naval Reserve midshipmen embarked in the USS Bailey, one of the six destroyers in a 10-ship squadron which sailed recently for a summer training cruise in European waters.

The task group headed first for Antwerp, Belgium, where the midshipmen will take tours to Amsterdam and The Hague. Other ports of call will be Lisbon, Portugal, and Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The group will return to Norfolk, Va. Sept. 5. The cruise is primarily designed for Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps midshipmen from 24 colleges and universities throughout the nation and will stress shipboard navigation, gunnery, communications, and tactics to supplement college classroom studies.
