**HARBOR NURSES TO HOLD FIRST NURSING INSTITUTE**

Nursing Institute, first of its kind to be undertaken by the group, will be held at Harbor Junior College, Sept. 24, 8:30 a.m. to 9 p.m., by the Harbor Area Nurses Association, District 21. First hour of morning session will be devoted to registration, invocation, and welcome.

A demonstration of techniques used in teaching the deaf will be presented at 9:30 a.m. by deaf pupils from Barton Hill School in San Pedro. Dr. Victor John Tracy, consulting otologist at attending otologist of Los Angeles County General Hospital, will speak on up-to-date treatments for the deaf child. A heart surgery symposium, conducted by David E. Boody, M.D., senior physician in the Thoracic and Cardiovascular Department at Harbor General Hospital, will highlight the afternoon. Following the symposium, Benjamin Kuchar, M.D., chest surgeon of Santa Monica, will show a film of actual heart surgery. Climax of the conference will be a banquet and entertainment hour. Hawaiian Folk Songs by Mae Nishimoto and Swiss yodeling and accordion music by Ida Bradner and Helen Wells will be featured. Singing Strings directed by Harry Hall, also will perform. Closing lecture will deal with paintings done by mentally ill patients, and how these may be interpreted to better understand and treat the patient. Speaker is Brunon Bielski, M.D., neurologist and psychiatrist of L. A. County General Hospital.
