

Five Staff Promotions Announced

Board of Education approval of promotions to administrative positions for five members of the Harbor Junior College staff were announced yesterday by Raymond J. Casey, Tech director.

Persons receiving promotions, with the positions they will fill include Kenneth R. Williams, coordinator of industrial and business relations; William N. Kopley Jr., coordinator of public relations; Dr. Ralph K. Timothy, college counselor; Reginald E. Sundin, chairman of the division of applied technology, and Montagu M. Wadey, chairman

of the division of natural science. The promotions in effect represent the assumption of additional duties since those being promoted will continue with their regular full-time instructional or other duties, Casey indicated.

"We at Harbor Tech are especially pleased with the Board's official approval of the promotions because some of the new administrators have been performing their additional duties for as long as three years without extra remuneration or recognition," Casey said.

Hunting Tag Sale On For Annual Kids Day

Hunting licenses went on sale this week which will enable holders to take a crack at some mighty big booty. Kiwanis Club-sponsored Kids Day is all set for Saturday, Sept. 27, at El Prado Parkway, and Kiwanians have been hustling to round up prizes, hot dogs, soft drinks, and favors.

Each child 12 years of age or under who shows up Sept. 27 with a bright orange hunting license will be admitted to the parkway. Capsules will contain prize checks which can be redeemed at booths. The licenses are on sale by most Torrance merchants for 25 cents.

At 2 p.m. a Torrance Soap Box Derby will be held on Pennsylvania Ave. between 237th and 240 Sts. Only Torrance sponsored racers can qualify for the derby.

Already on hand for the winners of the derby are a Longines watch and a long-playing record player.

An adult's treasure hunt, numbered tickets for which are available at Torrance merchants for \$1, will be held Friday night, Sept. 26. Numbered ticket winners will be asked to match their stubs with the numbers found in downtown merchants' windows on Saturday.

Clerk, Carrier Exams Slated By Post Office

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for appointment to the positions of Substitute Clerk and Carrier in the Torrance Post Office. The basic rate of pay for substitutes is \$1,615 an hour. Appointments are usually made to substitute positions, and promotions made to regular positions according to seniority of appointment.

Applicants must actually reside within the delivery zone of the Torrance Post Office, or be bona fide patrons of the office. Persons employed in the Torrance Post Office will be considered bona fide patrons of the office.

No experience is required. Applicants must qualify in the written test.

Further information and application card Form 5000-AB may be obtained from the Commission's local secretary, L. C. Messerve, located at Torrance, and must be on file with the Regional Director, Twelfth U.S. Civil Service Region not later than the close of business on Oct. 20, 1952.

Finch Meets With Letter Carriers

Bob Finch, candidate for Congress from the 17th Congressional District, appeared as a guest of the Torrance Postal Letter Carriers at a breakfast meeting in Torrance last Sunday.
