Admission to the rally is free. Art Woodcock of Torrance heads up the Torrance-Lomita area "Bucks for Bob" committee.



## Registrar Hires Crew for Sample Ballot Marking Job

The enormous job of addressing 2,500,000 sample ballots to voters, Hite said a crew of 390 men and women have been assigned elections got under way in earnest last week, according to

the ballots ready for the mail by Oct. 15.

Meanwhile, more than 1500 requests for absentee ballots have been received from members of the Armed Forces, Hite reported. Several thousand additional requests have come in from civilians, he said.

Hite explained that his office cannot legally accept the requests until Oct. 15. With respect to civilian requests, he said, his office is sending out a

form application blank asking that it be returned Oct. 15. Ballots must be voted on or before Nov. 4 and can be received by the registrar's office not later than Nov. 20. Hite said he expected to have a final registration figure for Los Angeles County by this week end.


