Editor Torrance Herald: I cannot conceive of any legitimate organization that would sponsor a movement to deny women the right to vote. It seems to me they have very little to do.



Educators Seek School Sites In North Torrance

School authorities will purchase a site for another North Torrance area elementary school because of the exceptional growth of the area, it was indicated at last week's Board of Education meeting.

Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, told board members that there presently are 602 homes under construction in the North Torrance area and present schools already are becoming crowded.

A school is under construction on 174th St. and the school district owns another plot near Arlington Ave. and 186th St. Hull pointed out that the City Planning Commission recently has approved plans for 200 more homes, though permits have not been written.

In the South Torrance area, possibility of construction of 2522 homes is worrying the board, although school sites already have been purchased or selected, it was stated. A new site on the Ellinwood Tract, west of Waveria and South of Pacific Coast Hwy., is now being eyed.
