### West Basin May Receive More Funds for Fresh Water Barrier

Remainder of the \$750,000 state appropriation to test means of halting ocean water intrusion into ground water basins by injecting fresh water as a barrier may be ultimately expended on the Manhattan Beach test, it was disclosed at a meeting of the State Water Resources Board held recently in Sacramento. West Basin project has been allocated \$450,000, and an additional \$300,000 has been given to the University of California for laboratory testing.

**Dual Purposes**  
Injection of the fresh water barrier would serve a dual economic purpose, according to the Association. Injected water would not only exert pressure sufficient to resist encroachment from the sea, but would balance this pressure with that of advancing ocean water and be directed inland to add to the natural supply of the basin.

**Walls Studied**  
State Water Resources Board also is making a study of using impervious subsurface cutoff walls to stop salt intrusion into ground water basins. Board will hold its November meeting in San Diego County and will examine the site of a proposed experiment of this nature at the mouth of the San Luis Rey River near Oceanside. West Basin Water Association has some on record as opposing the use of any of the \$750,000 state fund in connection with the cutoff wall experiment, "as this money was clearly voted by the legislators for facilities necessary to introduce water into water-bearing aquifers," the Association said.
