Torrance benefited to the tune of \$26,509.43 for upkeep and repair of various streets in the city under a resolution authorizing appropriations from the Motor Vehicle Fund Aid to cities, Supervisor Raymond V. Darby announced this week.

Also on the fund-receiving list released by the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County was Redondo, which will receive \$24,172 for the same purpose.

## State Will Get Gas From--Shhh

Southern California and Southern Counties Gas Companies have launched a joint \$5 million expansion program whereby natural gas from the big state of Texas will be piped to California consumers.

Work on two booster stations in the California desert was authorized last week. This project, when completed, will provide pipelines to bring an additional 300 million cubic feet of natural gas into California each day.

Half of the gas is to go to Southern companies and the other half to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of San Francisco. When the entire project is completed, Southern companies will receive an additional 555 million cubic feet.
