

Police Bullets Halt Speeding Suspects

Bullets fired by pursuing police brought to a halt a car loaded with youngsters which was fleeing at high speed along foggy Avalon Blvd. early Monday, according to reports. Officers J. B. Jameson and P. M. Scott said they observed a 1936 model sedan roaring along the thoroughfare near Sepulveda Blvd. at a speed of 75 miles per hour. The fog was so thick, they said, that the driver had to stick his head out of the window for better visibility.

Refused to Stop
When the police car drew alongside, the driver refused to halt and swerved his auto towards the patrol car, the officers said. Then Officer Scott fired five shots from his service revolver and punctured the rear tires of the fleeing auto, it was reported.

Bishop to Speak Next Sunday at Central Church

Bishop Ira D. Warner, resident bishop of the Pacific Area for the Evangelical United Brethren Church, will be honored guest at the Central Church, Marcellina and Arlington, Sunday morning, it was announced yesterday by Rev. Homer H. Miller, pastor of the church.

The visiting church official will speak on the subject: "The Message and the Mission of the Church," Rev. Miller said.

Elected to his present post from the pastorate of the largest church in the denomination at Akron, Ohio, Bishop Warner's areas cover all of the Rocky Mountain states and Montana, Washington, Oregon, and California conferences. In addition to his area here,

Bishop Warner is responsible for the supervision of the denominational missionary program in Sierra Leone, West Africa, and Northern Nigeria, British West Africa. He has made numerous trips to the African mission fields and will leave again this month to preside over the conference there in January. Rev. Miller reports. As senior Bishop, he is chairman of the Board of Bishops of the Evangelical United Brethren Church. He has written a number of books of a denominational nature, and is a member of various denominational boards and inter-faith groups.

Enrollment at El Camino Hits New High

Final enrollment figures to date for the current semester at El Camino College indicated a record total of 4905 persons enrolled, Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel said today. Of this figure the men outnumber the women by almost two to one—the figures showing 3130 men and 1775 women. Last spring the enrollment was 4100. The fall semester saw the enrollment of 2771 new students. Of this number 1704 were men and 1067 were women. Veteran students totaled 271, including 284 men and seven women.
