



Gusman, a heavy weapons infantryman with the 2d Infantry Division, has been awarded the Parachutist Badge and the Army of Occupation Ribbon for service in Japan. He entered the Army in December, 1950.

Police Warn Merchants on Stolen Checks

Torrance merchants were warned yesterday by Det. Sgt. Percy Bennett of the Torrance Police Department to be on the lookout for some payroll checks allegedly stolen from the Hughes Aircraft Co. earlier in the week.

Seven checks totaling nearly \$500 were reported stolen and may be cashed somewhere in the Torrance area, Bennett said.

The checks were made out to C. W. Baldwin, W. J. Baldasti, C. P. Badger, M. L. Baker, F. Balala, M. Becker, and L. W. Austin. The amounts ranged from \$46.11 to \$125.78, Bennett said.

The checks are regular Hughes Aircraft Co. payroll checks and are drawn on the Culver City branch of the Bank of America. Sgt. Percy Bennett asked to be notified if anyone tries to cash any such check in this area.

City to Present Highway Problem To State Again

Demands that the city try again to reach someone's ear in Sacramento regarding the traffic hazards along Hwy. 101 at the entrances to Seaside Ranchos and Hollywood Riviera was voiced Wednesday evening by Councilman Harvey B. Spelman Jr.

Spelman reported to the councilmen that "it appears that we have been unsuccessful in getting action by contacting the local State agencies, and I believe we should see what we can do by contacting officials in Sacramento again."

The speed limit through the area has been reduced to 45 miles per hour, but the combinations of a hill, a curve, and the single exit from the Ranchos onto the busy highway make the area a highly hazardous strip of roadway, city officials and residents of the area have declared repeatedly.

Councilman Spelman also requested the traffic committee of the Council to check into the suggestion that the speed limits within the Seaside Ranchos area be reduced to 10 miles per hour from the present 25.

FLIGHT SCHEDULED

Drews Made Ward Of Court As Case Ends

The tragic story of the boy who accidentally shot to death his younger sister came to an end in Los Angeles Superior Court Wednesday—but Judge William B. McKesson, disregarding a coroner's jury verdict which exonerated the youth, made him a ward of the juvenile court.

In placing Marion Allen (Joe) Drews, 14, in custody of an older sister living in a nearby community, Judge McKesson castigated the parents who loaded firearms around where their children can get them, saying: "There are too many cases of children being killed by their parents with guns, and I sincerely hope that my action in this case, in which I felt I should disregard the verdict exonerating the boy, will convey a warning to parents of their responsibility in keeping firearms out of the reach of children."

"Live Down Ordeal" Judge McKesson removed the boy from his widowed mother's custody on the recommendation of Probation Officer L. K. D. Bus. He added he did not wish to reveal the location of the boy's new home so that he "might live down 'the ordeal through which he has passed.'" On Oct. 26, Joe and his sis-


