Without guidance these youngsters form clubs—gangs—of their own, and because they are insecure they imitate the adults who look most secure—the tough character—and we call them "juvenile delinquents"! If you have a child in these age groups, call the school he or she attends. Officials there can put you in touch with the Scouts in your neighborhood—help your child to "be prepared!"

Ever since school began in September, Keystoners have been carrying on about the need for a safety program to safeguard the children of the Carson St. School. However, last Thursday's safety program makes one wonder about the indifference of people. Just 13 people came to see the wonderful movie and to hear the speaker provided for this meeting.
