

'Toys for Tots' Campaign Under Way in Local Area

Underprivileged children in this area will have toys for Christmas, after all.

Long Beach's Marine Reservists, joining other Marine Corps Reserve units all over the country, will collect "Toys for Tots" in this vicinity during the Christmas season.

This is the second year that the Corps has collected Christmas toys for children who might otherwise be forgotten. No "Toys for Tots" program was carried out in this area for the last two years due to mobilization of the local unit at the beginning of the Korean conflict.

Details of the program for this area were announced this week by Maj. John H. Maher, inspector-instructor of the Fifth Signal Co., U. S. Marine Corps Reserve. He said members of the unit thought this was the best way in which they could join the community's celebration of Christmas.

Maj. Maher said residents of the Los Angeles County area can say "Merry Christmas" to underprivileged children by:

1. Giftwrapping a new or used toy, with a tag on the outside indicating whether the toy is for a girl or boy, and the age at which the toy would be most enjoyed.
 2. Dropping the toy or toys at collection at Long Beach and at all schools in the Torrance Unified School District.

Two New Schools For Keystone

Contracts totaling \$223,090 for the construction of two new schools in the Keystone area were awarded by the Los Angeles City Board of Education last week.

A 24-classroom plant is to be constructed at 223rd St. and Dolores Ave. at a cost of \$207,500.

A 12-classroom school is to be built at 232nd Pl. and Figueroa at a cost of \$115,590.

Successful bidder for both schools was the Hudson Construction Co. There were seven other bids on the Dolores school and six others on the 232nd Pl. school.

Construction is slated to begin later this week and completion is hoped for by February. Awarding of the bids was expedited as much as possible so that the schools may be ready to receive a flood of new enrollments expected between now and the beginning of the spring semester.
