Proposed State Law to Double Collection Cost for Torrance

Legislative action to prohibit the feeding of raw garbage to hogs would cost the city of Torrance about \$25,000 a year, City Manager George Stevens estimated yesterday.

Stevens made the statement after attending a meeting of the legislative interim committee on agriculture and livestock problems. One of the proposals under study by the committee is the enactment of a law to force the boiling of garbage before it is fed to hogs.

"Right now," Stevens said, "about 2500 tons of garbage is being collected in Torrance every year." Total cost of this collection and the tin cans which are about \$36,000 a year, according to terms of the present contract with George Green Fed to Hogs.

The garbage fed to hogs on a farm in Torrance, the cans are funneled into a reclaiming plant which processes them to reclaim metals in the material. "Cost of this collection service is 28 cents per month for each electric meter in Torrance," the city manager pointed out.

This is a very reasonable sum, he emphasized. The city of Gardena is currently operating on a rate of 83 cents per

Time Is Keynote to Christmas Card Plan

Postmaster Clara A. Conner has some special ideas about how Christmas can be made merrier.

In fact, she's planning to send the perfect Christmas card: Naturally, the postmaster hopes the rest of us will follow her example, because actually it's the only way a Christmas card should be sent.

"Once this card was selected," she began, "I'd make sure it was delivered to the right address and in plenty of time. Time, it seems, is the keynote to the plan. For each year the post office receives thousands of Christmas cards too late for delivery by Dec. 25, 25. And many a Christmas package has suffered the same fate.

"Mr. and Mrs. may be and is used, but mainly for formal or business acquaintances. However, personalized Christmas cards (on which the signature is imprinted) frequently use "Mr. and Mrs."

Postmaster Conner emphasizes that you should address the envelopes in your very best handwriting. A carefully addressed envelope is helpful to the mailman, and a welcome sight to your friends. So be sure to include the full name, house number, street, city, zone, state and return address in upper left hand corner of the envelope.

If all of us follow through on the postmaster's plan for a "perfect Christmas card," the rest will be comparatively easy. "What's more, you can write a personal message on them, which isn't authorized for third-class mail. Just a little note makes your Christmas cards a lot more exciting to receive."

Christmas card etiquette is equally important, the postmaster explains. She points out that the trend is to be as informal as possible.

Sealed proposals will be received in the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, Torrance, California, until 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 22, 1952, for constructing, in accordance with specifications and drawings, a 12" cast iron distribution water main. The work includes construction of approximately 4,400 linear feet of 12" cast iron distribution mains located on Pacific Coast Highway east of Hawthorne Boulevard. The City will furnish all cast iron pipe, fittings, valves, valve boxes, fire hydrant assemblies and service connection materials. The contractor will be required to furnish all other materials, including all special fittings and joining materials.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check or a bid bond in the amount of 10% of the estimated amount of the bid.
