## SPIRITUAL VALUES TOLD TO CRENSHAW GROUP

"Foundations for Spiritual Values," a talk by Vernon B. Sheblak, principal of Adult Education at Torrance High School, highlighted last week's Wednesday meeting of Crenshaw Elementary Parent-Teacher Association.

As a background for the group discussion which followed his talk, Sheblak enumerated the moral and spiritual values of the American people, as defined by the Education Policies Commission, National Education Association of the United States.

These values, he said, are human personality, moral responsibility, institutions as the servants of men, common consent, devotion to truth, respect for excellence, moral equality, brotherhood, the pursuit of happiness, and spiritual enrichment.

Discussion centered around what parents and teachers can do to stimulate high standards of morality in conduct of those under their guidance.

The group placed setting good examples of honesty and truth, church attendance, and expecting high standards of conduct from their children as good ways to encourage high standards.

In all P.T.A. members named 10 ways, including tolerance for other people and creeds and showing love and affection in family life, which they agreed would help.
