


EC Dominates All-Metro Eleven

Five Caminans On First Team Crawford QB

El Camino's football team, led by Bill Crawford, dominated the All-Metro Football conference eleven, placing five men on the first string and two on the second.

The champions of the Metro league, undefeated in seven contests, secured the right guard, left tackle, quarterback, right half and fullback positions. Every team but Impasse Harbor JC, which lost all league contests, and Santa Monica, had at least one man on the first two strings.

The backfield was lifted practically intact from the Warrior squad, only Burnell Jamerson of Bakersfield, breaking the Camino stranglehold.

In addition to Crawford, fleet Kenny Swearingen and Big Jim Carmichael, the bruising fullback, were picked on the starting eleven.

In the line, it was Bob Warnock at left tackle and Stan Swanson at right guard. Swanson, a 160-pounder from Inglewood High, was pushing 250 pound opponents around all season.

Vince Benstead, center, and Preston Dills, tackle, were named to the second string.

Six Back Next Year
Of the seven honored, six of them are freshmen, and will be back next year. The only man to miss will be Benstead. Aside from Crawford, Torrance, and Swearingen, Redondo, all learned their football at Inglewood High.

The other six spots on the first team were split two to Valley, two to East Los Angeles and one each to Bakersfield and San Diego.
