Sepulveda Freeway Extension Is Planned Through Torrance

Torrance sits smack in the middle of the extension of the proposed Sepulveda Freeway, according to an announcement yesterday by the State Highway Commission.

Previously adopted plans call for the freeway to run from Waddington St. in San Fernando Valley to Florence Ave. with Highway 101 near El Toro.

The freeway will enter Torrance city limits at approximately 174th St., will cross Crossshaw Blvd., then parallel 190th St. (roughly) as it intersects both Western Ave. and Normandie Blvd.

It leap-frogs the proposed Harbor Freeway, to be constructed along Figueroa St. for much of its length, and then slants through Signal Hill, Long Beach, and parts of Orange County to a junction with 101.

The announcement said the proposed Sepulveda extension "is entirely new in location and is intended to provide traffic relief for the congested arteries of the area."

The commission said it planned to adopt the route and asked State Highway Engineer G. T. McCoy to query city and county governments concerned to certain if public hearings are desired before final action on the extension is taken.

Torrance city officials could not be reached for comment.

If the extension is approved and constructed, Torrance area residents planning a trip to San Diego will find the whole route one of high-speed travel, since the commission announcement included approval of extension of the Santa Ana Freeway for 19 miles from Niguel Rd. west of El Toro, to the San Diego County line.

Both proposals are part of an overall plan which includes freeway travel from the Los Angeles Civic Center to the Mexican border.

The Sepulveda extension, if, as and when completed, will join the Santa Ana Freeway at about the same point to which that route has been planned—Niguel Rd.
