SCHOOL SUPPLY EQUIPMENT AND REPAIRS
Notice is hereby given that the Board of Education of the Torrance Unified School District of Los Angeles County will receive bids for furnishing certain school supplies, equipment and repairs as per list and specifications on file in the office of the Business Manager, 2335 Plaza Del Amo, Torrance.
Each bid must be submitted on a printed form furnished by the Board of Education, must be sealed and filed in the Business Manager's office on or before Friday, Jan. 4, 1952 at 10:00 a. m. and will be opened in public at that time and place and each bid aggregating \$1,000 or over must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check for not less than 5% of the total amount of the bid; provided that if only certain items of a bid are accepted, the bidder may thereupon substitute a certified or cashier's check for 5% of the aggregate amount of the accepted items on the bid; and providing further that firms doing business regularly with the Board of Education may at the discretion of the Business Manager and in lieu of the above mentioned surety company, furnish in the sum not less than \$5,000.00 to insure compliance with the terms of their signed bids submitted from time to time during the life of the bond.
The above mentioned check or bidder's bond shall be given as a guarantee to the Board of Education with the terms of his signed bid; and the successful bidder shall be bound to comply with the terms of his signed bid, after acceptance thereof by the Board. A check or bond will be forfeited.
Other conditions being equal, preference will be given to the products of the State of California.
The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or any part of a bid, and to waive any informality in the bids received.
Firms or individuals desiring to submit bids from time to time for school supplies and equipment shall list themselves with said Business Manager of the Torrance Unified School District.

COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 1554 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SANITARY SEWERS
IN 223rd STREET
AND OTHER RIGHTS OF WAY
RESOLUTION OF INTENTION
WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, has on file and spread upon the minutes of the Board, a report from the Health Officer of the County recommending the institution of proceedings for the improvement as a health measure, and
WHEREAS, the Board has found and determined by resolution that the public interest requires the construction of sanitary sewers 223rd STREET and other rights of way and that the improvement is necessary as a health measure, and
WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Los Angeles has by resolution adopted on the 3rd day of December, 1952, approved this resolution and given its consent to the work proposed herein, and to the use of that portion of Normandy Avenue lying within said city as described herein, and to the exercise of exclusive jurisdiction in this proceeding by said Board of Supervisors.
NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD RESOLVES:

SECTION 1.
That the public interest and necessity that it is the intention of the Board to order the following work to be done and improvement made, to-wit:
First, the construction of sanitary sewers and appurtenances in and between the east side of NORMANDIE AVENUE (easterly roadway) and the easterly line of MEYLER STREET in NORMANDIE AVENUE (easterly roadway) and
between MEYLER STREET and southerly lines of 223rd STREET.
Second, the reconstructing of the trench in the streets and rights of way wherein aforementioned sanitary sewers are constructed.
All of said work shall be performed in accordance with the limits, hereinafter designated except where the plans indicate that said work shall be omitted.
THAT SUCH WORK OR IMPROVEMENT IS ESTIMATED WILL COST THE SUM OF EIGHT THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS (\$8,550.00).

SECTION 2.
That all the work and improvements aforesaid shall be done and performed as shown on and in accordance with and to the grades shown on the plans, profiles and specifications thereon, filed in the office of the Board of Supervisors in the Hall of Records in the City of Los Angeles on the 7th day of October, 1952. Reference is hereby made to said plans, profiles and specifications for a full and detailed description of said proposed work or improvement, and said plans, profiles and specifications shall govern for all details of the proposed work or improvement and for the description of the grade to which this work is to be done, and are made a part hereof.

SECTION 3.
That the said contemplated work or improvement, in the opinion of the Board, is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and the Board hereby makes the expense of the work or improvement chargeable upon a district, which district the Board hereby declares to be the district benefited by the work or improvement and to be assessed to pay the cost and expense thereof.
A map of the district, indicating by a boundary line the extent of the territory included in the proposed district approved by the Board on the 7th day of October, 1952, is on file in the office of the Board. Reference is hereby made to the map for full and complete description of the assessment district and the map shall govern for all details as to the extent of the assessment district.

SECTION 4.
That serial bonds shall be issued in accordance with Division 7, Streets and Highways Code, to represent each assessment of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more remaining unpaid for thirty (30) days after the date of the recording of the warrant. The serial bonds shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of January next succeeding the next October fifteenth following their date, and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable, by coupon, on the second day of January every year after the next October fifteenth following their date, until the whole is paid, and the interest shall be payable semiannually, by coupon, on the second days of January and July, respectively, of each year following the date of the bonds, at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum on all sums unpaid, until the whole of the principal and interest is paid.

SECTION 5.
That the proceedings for the aforesaid work or improvement shall be under and in accordance with Division 7, Streets and Highways Code, and County Ordinance No. 448 (New Series) providing that all payments upon the assessment within ten days upon the recording thereof shall be made to the County Surveyor.
SECTION 6.
The streets hereinafter referred to are public streets in the County of Los Angeles, and are located partly in unincorporated territory in the vicinity of Torrance and partly in the City of Los Angeles.

SECTION 7.
That it is the opinion of the Board that the public interest will not be served by allowing the property owner to take the contract for the work to be done under these proceedings.
SECTION 8.
That Tuesday, the 18th day of January, 1953, at the hour of ten o'clock A.M. of said day, in the day and hour and the Chambers of the Board in the Hall of Records, in the City of Los Angeles, is the place fixed by the Board when and where any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work or improvement or to the extent of the district to be assessed, or to the proposed grades to which the work is to be done, or to any or all of the foregoing, may appear before the Board and show cause why the proposed work or improvement should not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

SECTION 9.
That the County Surveyor shall cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of the contemplated work or improvement and along all open streets within the district liable to be assessed, notices of the adoption of this Resolution in the manner and in the form required by law.
SECTION 10.
The Clerk of the Board shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution and shall cause the same to be published for two days in the Torrance Herald, a newspaper published and circulated in the County of Los Angeles, which is hereby designated for that purpose by the Board.
The Board does hereby direct the Clerk thereof to mail notices of the adoption of this Resolution of intention to all persons owning real property proposed to be assessed for the work herein described whose names and addresses appear on the last qualified assessment roll of the County of Los Angeles or as known to the Clerk, the contents of said notices to be as required by law.
The foregoing resolution was on the 18th day of December, 1952, adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California.
