New officers for the Torrance Chamber of Commerce were elected last night at a fellowship meeting of the Board of Directors held at the Jonathan Club in Los Angeles. Results of the election came too late to be included in this issue of the Torrance Herald.

Although selections of the nominating committee have not been made public, the Herald learned from reliable sources that the president, Robert E. Flo and a representative from the merchant firm, was being considered for return to that office.

Joining the board of directors at the dinner will be members of the City Council, Superintendent of Schools J. H. Hull, and a representative from the Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Wm. Davies of Canada Joins Dr. Stetson Here

Dr. William A. Davies, ending a three-year practice of general medicine in Canada, will join Dr. Rodney A. Stetson in the practice of industrial and general medicine, it was announced this week by the latter physician.

Dr. Davies, is bringing his wife, also a doctor, and two children to Torrance today. They will make their home at 2835 Sonoma Ave. He sought Torrance as a place in which to enter practice because he wished to settle in a growing community and to take advantage of the "fine schools here," he said.

He is a graduate of Dominican College of San Rafael and of the School of Medicine of the University of Michigan. He served his internship at the Vancouver General Hospital where he also held a residence specializing in Obstetrics and Gynecology.

He did post-graduate and anesthesiology at the Vancouver Hospital and as a surgeon at the University of Oregon.

Dr. Davies is a member of Alpha Kappa Kappa, the Canadian Medical Association, and the British Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons.

He comes to Torrance from Vancouver, B. C., where he conducted a general practice in that rural community.

His wife, Jane, a pediatrician, may join Dr. Stetson and her husband in practice at a later date.

In moving here, the two doctors and their children become members of the Nativity Parish.

Dr. Davies will occupy the offices in the medical building at 2406 Torrance Blvd. with Dr. Stetson which were formerly used by Dr. Ralph McNeil who is moving to the new medical building across the street.

Local Chamber Has Supply Of Tax Blanks

Answer Filed In \$55,000 Death Suit

An answer to a \$55,000 lawsuit raising out of an accident in which a Harbor City man was killed, has been filed in Superior Court in Long Beach, according to Dudley Gray, attorney for the wife of the crash victim.

Through Attorney Gray, Mrs. Ruth Simmons, 2257 W. 148th St., is asking \$50,000 for the death of her husband and \$5000 for injuries she sustained in an accident Dec. 21, 1951. Her husband, George, died in May of 1952 after undergoing two brain operations. The accident occurred at Sepulveda Blvd. and Figueroa St.

The original action was filed against Carmen Medrano of Wilmington and Art Tucayo of Seattle, who were in the car which struck the auto in which Simmons was killed, according to Attorney Gray.
