

Noted Author Tells Writers Club What Is Needed to Sell Stories

"Having a story that you just want to tell, is much more important than just a lot of fine writing," Adela Roger S. Johns, famous author, told her audience last Friday night at the recreation hall of the Clark Stadium in Hermosa. The occasion was the annual installation meeting of the Southwest Manuscripters, an organization which includes many Torrance writers.

"There is a great deal of fine writing being turned in to editors all over the country, but editors can't use most of it—it doesn't seem to be about anything vital, and 20 pages of just expressing yourself, isn't what editors want," she said.

Miss St. Johns has a story in the current issue of Good Housekeeping Magazine and one in last month's Cosmopolitan. She told her audience how those stories were written, from the inception of the main idea for the story, and of how much polishing and re-writing is necessary before a story is mailed to a magazine or publisher.

"Everything that happens to you from morning to night, is put for your mill as a writer. One of the main things to develop is an ability to recognize what will make a good story."


'Citizen of Year' Committee Named
