CHAPLAIN GANNON Receives Award

Chaplain Gannon Receives Medal For War Service

Meritorious service in Korea with a regiment of Southern California's 40th Infantry Division yesterday brought an award of the Bronze Star medal to Chaplain (Capt.) Thomas A. Gannon, 2077 W. 237th St., Torrance.

Gannon, now attached to the 115th Medical Battalion, was handed the medal Tuesday by Maj. Gilbert Frary, Van Nuys, commander, who is now reorganizing the unit in the National Guard following its service in Japan and Korea.

"Tirelessly," the citation read, "Chaplain Gannon performed religious services, enriching the spiritual lives of those men in combat. Without regard for his personal safety or comfort, Chaplain Gannon traveled many miles over rugged terrain to front-line positions in order to personally and spiritually aid his men."

In civil life Gannon is a Catholic priest and chaplain of Rancho Los Amigos, a county hospital establishment at Downey. The chaplain joined the medical battalion in August, 1950, and was called up for the Korean war with it the following month. In Japan he was assigned to the 224th Infantry Regiment and on his release from active duty was reassigned to the medical. Gannon was graduated from St. John's Major Seminary at Camarillo in 1946.

El Camino Classes in Television, Radio Keyed to Industrial Needs

Television and radio work instruction at El Camino College will get its face lifted during the spring semester, announced William H. Harless, director of instruction.

The application of electronics in industry brought about the changed emphasis, Harless said, and a new course will offer advanced study in this field.

The course also will provide the groundwork for further study in television and radio repair.

A study of industrial needs which was conducted by several technical and science instructors at the college, including Dr. William C. Reibsmann, Dr. Ferdinand E. DeLorme, Robert L. Brady, John L. Rowan, and Assistant Director of Instruction John Mills, brought about the change, Harless said.

"We found that the petroleum industry and other industries make considerable use of electronic instruments and electronic controls," he explained. "We found that these people need qualified workers to repair this electronic equipment. Many of the aircraft firms, Hughes Aircraft in particular, also make considerable use of electronics in their products."

Brady has been designated by the college as a special counselor for persons needing advice concerning the requirements of the electronic curriculum and other technical fields. He will be available both before and during registration for the coming semester, which begins Feb. 2.

Student Body President Named in ECC Run-Off

Willie Suzuki, Gardena, has been elected Student Body president at El Camino College following balloting in a run-off election. Election results showed Suzuki winning over Glynn Boyce, Torrance, by a narrow margin. The past semester Suzuki has been Associated Men Students' president.


