

Tax Collector Lists Rules for Tax Exemptions

Robert A. Riddell, director of Internal Revenue, today advised all persons who intend to claim dependency exemptions on their income tax returns to be certain that they comply with all the conditions that entitle them to the claim.

He stated that a sample survey on a nation-wide basis indicates that almost two and a half million of the fifty-five million taxpayers in the United States probably make errors on their returns in this respect.

Riddell laid down five tests which must be met before a dependency exemption can be properly claimed. They are:

1. The taxpayer must have provided more than half the cost of supporting the dependent for the year 1952.

2. The dependent's gross income during 1952 must have been less than \$600.

3. The dependent must be closely related to the taxpayer.

4. The dependent must be a citizen of the United States, or a resident of the United States, Mexico or Canada.

5. The dependent, if married, does not make a joint return with his or her spouse. Asked to define a close relative, the director stated that the law includes a child or descendant of the child; a stepchild (but not the descendant of the stepchild); brother; sister; half-brother; half-sister; step brother; step-sister; parent; grandparent or other direct ancestor; stepfather; step-mother; uncle; aunt; nephew, niece; father-in-law; mother-in-law; brother-in-law; sister-in-law; son-in-law; and daughter-in-law. A legally-adopted child is considered as a child by blood.

JULIA HOWE STARTED WOMEN'S CLUBS

When Samuel Howe, a publisher of The Commonwealth in Boston, Mass., came home his wife sat down on the horse-hair sofa beside him. "Sam," she began, "I want you to give me space on your editorial page —"

"Nonsense," he cut in. "Your place is in the home."

"I believe I can increase your circulation," she went on. His face beamed. "I want to organize our women," she stated while her husband's eyes dulled, "help them form a Club, we'll call it Woman's Club for Cultural and Self-Improvement."

"I'll be laughed at. No!" he exclaimed emphatically.

This could have been the conversation 86 years ago when Julia Ward Howe organized the first Women's Club. She wrote of suffrage and intellectual pursuits, pointed out the combined strength in government, not as a political group but as factually informed persons, through exchange of ideas they would be better mothers in better homes. Since January 11th, 1887 that idea of Julia Ward Howe has grown to be the largest group of women in the world. They are never static, always constructive and vitiate in time for better things to make a better and stronger America.
