

Phone Official To Describe Microwave Here

Microwave radio relay, used by the Bell System for the transmission of television programs and long-distance telephone calls, will be described and demonstrated to the Torrance Kiwanis Club at a dinner meeting on Feb. 16 by C. Corbin Devalon of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co.

According to program chairman K. L. Anderson, Devalon will discuss in simplified terms the operation of microwave radio relay as it is employed by the Bell System today on some 18,000 channel miles of its intercity television network routes.

The speaker will show how the microwaves are beamed like a searchlight in a direct line along a series of relay stations constructed at intervals of about 30 miles.

Devalon, graduate of Pomona College and Columbia University, started his telephone career in 1924 with the Bell System in New York City. He has appeared before many Southland groups to discuss current telephone developments.

Redlands Offers 40 Scholarships Worth \$40,000

High school and junior college students of this area are receiving invitations this week for the annual University of Redlands competitive scholarship examinations, which will be held at the University of Redlands Memorial Chapel Feb. 21.

Forty scholarships to the University of Redlands will be offered to California and Arizona students as a result of these examinations and those given already at other points in California and Arizona.

Administrator of the tests, being given from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., is Dr. Warren Mild, director of admissions at Redlands.

To compete in the examinations a student must send an official transcript of grades and pay an examination fee of one dollar. Students taking the exams must have at least a "B" average, scholastically. Advance registration is not necessary.

Scholarships being offered, stated Dr. Mild, include four full-tuition scholarships valued at \$2,200; eight scholarships valued at \$1,400; eight valued at \$1,100; 10 worth from \$500 to \$800; 10 special ability scholarships of \$365, and 10 junior transfer scholarships valued at \$550 each.

Gibson Gains Support of CIO Council

Additional labor support for Councilman John S. Gibson, seeking reelection in the 15th District, was announced this week.

Gibson was one of five incumbent councilmen to receive the endorsement of the Greater Los Angeles Council of the CIO.

In a letter to Gibson, Albert F. Lunceford, secretary-treasurer of the council, said: "It gives me great pleasure to inform you that the membership of the Greater Los Angeles CIO Council, comprised by a membership of more than 125,000 in the Los Angeles area, heartily endorses your candidacy for reelection."

Councilman Gibson already has been pledged full support of the San Pedro-Wilmington Central Labor Council, of the AF of L, whose membership includes that of some 60 locals, and totals more than 20,000 in the Los Angeles Harbor area.

Employers' Information Returns Due By Monday

Robert C. Kirkwood, Chairman of the Franchise Tax Board, stated that an estimated 600,000 information returns, Form 999, would be filed before the deadline, Monday, Feb. 16, 1953.

Employers of single persons who earn \$2000 or more and married persons whose income is \$3500 or more must file information returns. The returns must be accompanied by a Summary Return Form 996. Forms may be secured from the Los Angeles Office of the Board at 206 State Building, First and Broadway.




