'Brain' Maker Tells Optimists of Future

"The automatic factory is a thing of the future," a manufacturer of electronic "brains" told members of the Torrance Optimist Club Monday evening.

He didn't discount the idea of the automatic factory, however. In fact, he said his company had 200 persons working full time toward that end.

Speaking was Dick Sprague, vice-president of Computer Research Corp., a company which started with four men over Alma's Bakery at Carson and Andrea in 1950.

tral control point (the automatic factory), processing of commercial and industrial data, and for processing of data for governments.

One use to which the machines could be put now, he said, would be the automatic controlling of traffic signals according to the flow of traffic.

Such a machine is now being used in New York to check bookings of airline reservations.

Cushion Unneeded
"With this in operation, there is no need to keep a cushioned

of seats on a plane to cover duplication of reservations at the airport and at downtown ticket offices," he said. He explained that a clerk downtown puts a card in the machine and is told within two seconds what flights are available, at what time, and how many seats are left.

Such commercial uses of the "brain" are unlimited, he told the Optimists.


